

Good Tuning Notes

Flute (or) (check for flatness)

Oboe for oboists who tend to pinch, this is good (or) (check for flatness)

Bassoon (or) (check for flatness)

Clarinet (tune barrel) (pull at middle joint) (check for flatness)

Saxophone (or) (check for flatness)

Trumpet young player older player puts it in context some do this
 tune Bb side first, tune main slide tune F side, tune F slide check Bb side again some do this

Horn young player older player puts it in context to tune F attachment

Trombone young player older player puts it in context some do this

Euphonium young player older player puts it in context some do this

Tuba young player older player puts it in context some do this
